A SPIRITUAL PILGRIMAGE YOUR FIRST COMMUNION

Your First Communion was a historic event. It is important to keep in mind that you have a place in the history of the Eucharist, and it all began with your First Communion. The first time you received Jesus in the Eucharist was a historic moment. You stepped into a 2,000 year history of men and women participating in Eucharistic Glory. You became part of an eternal community that includes angels and saints who all come to the same table for this one meal. You received Jesus into your body and soul in the most intimate way possible for the first time.

Whether you receive the Eucharist for the first time at Baptism, at seven or seventy, that first time is just the beginning of the rest of your life. Every time you receive Jesus from that point forward, you have the chance to have a powerful encounter with the Alpha and Omega.

Nothing will transform your experiences of the Eucharist like harnessing the power of anticipation. One of the greatest temptations around the Eucharist is to treat it like a regular part of our routine instead of the most significant moment of our week. And the way to move beyond that spiritual obstacle is to begin to build anticipation. Throughout the week prepare for Liturgy by praying the Spiritual Communion each day, by reflecting on the Gospel for the coming Sunday, by fasting in order to intentionally become mindful of thehunger in your soul, and by arriving a few minutes early to quiet your heart, mind, body, and soul.

LESSON: You have a place in the history of the Eucharist. You have a place in the history of the Catholic Church. You have a place at God's altar. Every invitation to receive Jesus is an immeasurable honor. Every encounter has the power to be life changing. Harness the power of anticipation by preparing for Liturgy.

VIRTUE OF THE DAY: Hope: The virtue of hope is a delicate combination of desiring eternal life and expecting it. It is one of the three theological virtues (of which God is the object. Hope is a gift from God that leads us back to God.

SPIRITUAL COMMUNION: Jesus, I believe that You are truly present in the Most Holy Sacrament of the Eucharist. Every day I long for more of You. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot receive You sacramentally at this moment, I invoite You to come and dwell in my heart. May this spiritual communion increase my desire for the Eucharist. You are the healer of my soul. The the blindness from my eyes, the deafness from my ears, the darkness from my mind, and the hardness from my heart. Fill me with the grace, wisdom, and courage to do Your will in all things. My Lord and my God, draw me close to You, nearer than ever before. AMEN.
