A SPIRITUAL PILGRIMAGE UNTIL THE END OF THE WORLD

In 1163 a man was walking along the river Seine in Paris when he noticed a huge new building site. He asked one worker, "What are you building?" The man replied, "I'm just laying bricks." He asked another worker, "What are you building?" The worker scoffed and said, "Are you blind? I'm building a wall." Frustrated the man asked one more worker, "What are you building?" The builder stopped working and looked up toward the skiy and said, "We are building a cathedral. Cathedrals are beautiful and this will be the finest cathedral the world has ever seen. It will tower above the city, men and women will marvel at it, and people will come from all over the world to see it.

It took 182 years to finish the cathedral. Those who began building it never go to see it completed. It is 420 feet long, 157 feet wide, and 300 feet high. It is he Notre-Dame Cathedral. Men and women of all faiths come to Paris and marvel at it.

On April 15, 2019, at about 6 P.M. the city started going crazy. People were yelling and sirens stated blaring, dozens of them. **Notre-Dame was on Fire!** The world mourned as the iconic structure went up in flames. After the fire, people from all over the world pledged nearly one beillion dollars to rebuild it. This year, 2025 the cathedral was reopened.

LESSON: Jesus promished to be with us until the end of the world. He keeps that promise every day in the finest churches in the wealthiest cities and in the humblest churches in the poorest slums. Be mindful of His presence as you move about the world.

VIRTUE OF THE DAY: Sincerity: The virtue of sencerity involves being free from pretense, deceit, and hypocrisy. It is achieved by governing our words and actions with truth and justice. Keep your promises. If you say you will do something, do it.

SPIRITUAL COMMUNION: Jesus, I believe that You are truly present in the Most Holy Sacrament of the Eucharist. Every day I long for more of You. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot receive You sacramentally at this moment, I invoite You to come and dwell in my heart. May this spiritual communion increase my desire for the Eucharist. You are the healer of my soul. The the blindness from my eyes, the deafness from my ears, the darkness from my mind, and the hardness from my heart. Fill me with the grace, wisdom, and courage to do Your will in all things. My Lord and my God, draw me close to You, nearer than ever before. AMEN.
