A SPIRITUAL PILGRIMAGE CALLED TO HOLINESS

When you think about holiness, what comes to mind? Cabbage Patch Kids? Probably not.

An elderly priest named William Holt was wolking across a busy street in New York when a photographer asked to take his picture. Fr. William and the man got talking. He has so many stories after decades if wirjubg with people. The photographer asked if he had a fovorite. The old priest didn't have to think about it. Fr. William launched straight into the story.

"One Christmas there was a ten year old girl in my parish and she was dying of leukemia. All the girl wanted was a Cabbage Patch Doll. They were seventy-five dollars and to top it off, you couldn't get one, they were sold out everywhare. Her mother told me she looked in every store."

"That same day a family from my parish asked what I wanted for Christmas. They said they'd really like to do something special for me. I replied, 'One Cabbage Patch Doll and two walkie-talkies. The Cabbage Patch Doll went to the little girl. Then I gave one walkie-talkie to her and rthw other one to her twin brother, so they could speak while she was in isolation."

"After the girl passed away her mother wrote me a letter. It said, thank you for your goodness, your practical expression of God's love. Those walkie-talkies were the best medicine she ever had."

LESSON: Love is creative. Holiness is creative. There are an infinite number of ways to share the love of God with the people who enter our lives.

<u>VIRTUE OF THE DAY:</u> Enthusiasm: The virtue of enthusiasm leads us not just to love God and neighbor, but to vigorously seek out opportunities to do so. It reflects the state of a person's heart. Spiritual laziness leads to all manner of problems in this life and the next. Each day, choose a task that you have been avoiding or neglecting and attack it with new energy.

SPIRITUAL COMMUNION: Jesus, I believe that You are truly present in the Most Holy Sacrament of the Eucharist. Every day I long for more of You. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot receive You sacramentally at this moment, I invoite You to come and dwell in my heart. May this spiritual communion increase my desire for the Eucharist. You are the healer of my soul. The the blindness from my eyes, the deafness from my ears, the darkness from my mind, and the hardness from my heart. Fill me with the grace, wisdom, and courage to do Your will in all things. My Lord and my God, draw me close to You, nearer than ever before. AMEN.
